The Christmas Season (Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, and the Sundays after the Epiphany) - This Christmas season, our services focus around the broad theme of our encouragement in Christ. The key text for this theme comes from the appointed OT reading for the Third Sunday in Advent, Isaiah 35:4 - "Say to those who hearts are afraid, 'Be strong. Do not fear. You God will come. He will come to save you.'" (NirV). During the Sundays in Advent, we will use the OT readings to draw out their application for us as God's people here at Prince of Peace.

Pastor's Message

Greetings in the name of the Holy Child, whose coming into the world 2000 years ago we celebrate on December 25th; whose coming into each of our lives we celebrate daily as we remember our baptisms; and whose coming again we are confidently waiting to celebrate! I pray that this inaugural edition of our quarterly newsletter finds each of you full of faith and hope - faith in our God, and hope in how He is working in your life, and in our life together as a community of faith. Our theme for the coming quarter is ENCOURAGEMENT. I am drawing this theme from the appointed Old Testament reading for the Third Sunday in Advent. Here is the text from the prophet Isaiah - "Say to those whose hearts are afraid, 'Be strong. Do not fear. Your God will come. He will come to save you.'" (35:4). The coming of God in Christ is our source of encouragement - for our daily living, and for our journey together as a Lutheran Christian congregation.



In that spirit, I want to share with you a few words of encouragement about our life together. First, and perhaps most importantly, those in attendance at our congregational meeting on November 14th approved the 2011 budget which included partial year funding for a Director of Family Ministry! We have prayerfully journeyed together to get to this point. So now, after the first of the year, the call committee will begin in earnest the process to bring another full-time professional worker to our congregation. This is both a well-thought out and reasonable action, and an act of faith. Therefore, I ask your daily prayer for the process and for how the addition of a new staff member might allow us to widen our ministry to families both among us and in our wider southwest Topeka community. Second, I want to hold before you the many opportunities for worship this Christmas season, and especially want to encourage you - if you have had a difficult year because of loss or infirmity or struggle; or you know someone who has - to attend our Blue Christmas service on December 22nd. It is a service rich in the encouragement of Christ. Third, we will celebrate our congregational anniversary this year on March 6th, Transfiguration Sunday. At that time, we will commission another group of Stephen Ministers for service among us, and we will celebrate first communion for another class of young people. Please be sure to look at the service themes calendar elsewhere in the newsletter for more information about important dates and events. Finally, I want to encourage you to prayerfully become part of a Christ Care Small Group after the first of the year. We will be training another group of leaders and will be forming new groups. I cannot say it often enough, or emphasize it strongly enough, that Christ Care groups are our means to care for and encourage one another in ways that we simply cannot otherwise. These groups are our way to grow - to grow together in Christ, to grow spiritually with God, and to grow our congregation through witness and service in Christ's name.

I count it daily a privilege, an honor, and a great blessing to be your pastor. Carolyn and I, together with our daughters, Lorena and Donna, and our granddaughter, Natalia, wish you all a very blessed journey through Advent, Christmas and Epiphany, as together we journey in becoming more fully the healthy, caring and Christ-centered community of faith God has called us to be.

Proclaim the Living Christ, Live the peace of Christ!

A Note from Boone Smith

Youth Ministry Leader

Dear Friends at Prince of Peace, This past weekend I was at the Topeka Capital Plaza Hotel with about 425 highschoolers and adults for the Kansas District Youth Gathering. I met with several different Directors of Christian Education (DCEs) including Tommy Moll from Christ, Jim Bradshaw (former DCE, now serving in the District Office), and Leland Jackson from Western Kansas. It was great to see everyone again, and it reminded me of what it was like being a full-time DCE, which I served as for four years at Calvary Lutheran in North Topeka.

Each of these DCEs has served as a youth minister, and has given up time and energy to help their church and their youth group grow in new directions, including numerically and spiritually. They each maintain a level of organization and commitment to volunteers that keeps them working late into the night and on weekends, with summers as their heaviest time (since kids are out of school). DCEs expect to work 50+ hours every week, including Sundays of course, and to be away from home anywhere from one to three calendar weeks per-year with commitments to camps (like Tomah Shinga or LVR), mission trips, church worker conferences, and of course youth gatherings. DCEs are paid roughly what a public school teacher is paid, with a four-year degree, but without having the benefit of getting 3 months off per-year. In fact, the time that they work the hardest is the time that most teachers have off (Christmas, Easter, Spring Break, Summer). All of this with two weeks per-year of vacation. What a deal!

Of course it is rewarding to be a DCE also. The chance to work with kids and families up close and have a positive impact on all lives involved can be terrific. I believe that I went to more baptisms, funerals, and graduation parties during my time as a DCE at Calvary than at any other time in my life. I was literally paid to be a part of the lives of the congregation members. I sometimes had home visits in the evenings, I went and visited schools and sporting events, and even just stayed up late talking to kids who needed someone to talk to. I also lead several Bible Studies for youth and adults, organized youth events, and worked on programs within the congregation. This is some of what Prince of Peace should expect from their new Director of Family Ministry (who will likely be trained as a DCE). Incidentally, many of these are very difficult to pull off as a part-time youth leader, while balancing a full-time job elsewhere.

Now, to tamp down expectations just a little bit, let me tell you what a DCE/DFM is not going to be able to do. First, a DCE/DFM will not mean an immediate jump in giving for the congregation. Giving is a spiritual matter that is between the giver and God, and should have very little to do with who is on staff where the money is being received. Likewise, if simply hiring more staff meant an increase in giving, churches across America would be brimming with staff. Second, a DCE/DFM will not guarantee a fast-growing youth group with more kids than we know what to do with. While this is the hope for all churches, it stands to reason that if every DCE could bring in 50+ youth, every church would have one. That simply isn't so. Finally, a DCE is not the one missing "silver bullet" to whatever is ailing the church. DCEs are human too, and should not be expected to perform miracles when they arrive. They can't magically turn water into wine, and they can't create a family-life-ministry program out dust. Instead, like with most things this side of heaven, for a DCE/DFM to be successful here at Prince of Peace, they will need to put in some hard work, and they will need strong and committed volunteers in the programs that they try to bring here.

So is a full-time, called DCE/DFM the right choice for Prince of Peace. In my opinion, absolutely YES. They can connect with members, families and youth in wonderful ways. They can bring programs to strengthen the ministry that is already going on at Prince of Peace, and can provide vision and leadership in areas that can be overlooked. DCEs & DFM's can also help the church to do that which the church has set about doing, but in a much more effective way. As you read this, please pray for our future DCE/DFM. We don't know their name yet, but please pray that God will prepare their hearts, minds, bodies, and their volunteers for a powerful and effective ministry here at Prince of Peace.

Don't explain yourself-repent. Don't make excuses-repent. Don't seek to justify yourself-repent.

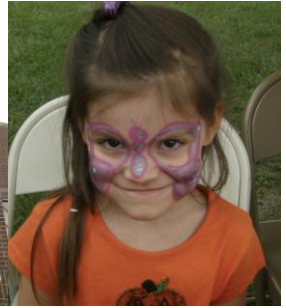
